Her last duty station was a Naval Leadership Instructor in Coronado California. Upon receiving her honorable discharge from the Navy, she moved back to her home state where she continues to further her career in administration, and obtained her master's degree from Johns Hopkins University.

When Kate returned from active duty, she began working at the Cox Science Center, formerly known as the South Florida Science Center, as she was a previous volunteer at the Science Center in the late 90s. Today, Kate is the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Cox Science Center and Aquarium.
